

# **2025 UNIFORM HANDBOOK**



### INTRODUCTION

Golden Grove Lutheran Primary School has a compulsory school uniform and sports uniform which is outlined in the following pages. Information concerning the purchase of uniform items can be obtained from the school.

We believe the uniform encourages students to take pride in their appearance, that it eliminates competition in what students wear, and that it is the most economical way to outfit students for their school life.

We expect students to wear the correct uniform whenever they are under the care of the school and to maintain a neat and tidy appearance at such times. If students spend time down the street before going home, and stay in their uniform, they are expected to wear the complete uniform until they reach home. Students, who come to school, or to a sports lesson, not dressed in the complete uniform must have a note signed by a parent explaining the reason. Notes are valid for one week only.

The following details and comments are there to guide you and to clarify issues that may arise.

# GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

We are proud of our uniform, and trust that students will treat it as an important way of honouring their school community.

To maintain the appearance of our school and its uniform, parents are asked to comply with the following general requirements.

All students must wear the school uniform while at school and when travelling to and from school, except when special permission is otherwise given. The school would like to have the full co-operation of parents in ensuring that our school uniform is worn correctly.

As a guide to length of skirt and dress, hem is to be no shorter than the top of the knee.

Sneakers may only be worn with the sports uniform (see specifications below).

# SEASONAL CHANGEOVER PERIOD

Term 2 and 4

There is no seasonal changeover period for boys, and they can elect to wear the uniform in a manner of their choosing if it abides by the set guidelines.

When the temperature is above 22 degrees, the girls summer uniform may be worn in lieu of the winter uniform.



# HAIRSTYLES AND COLOURS

The general expectation regarding hairstyles and colour for both boys and girls is that they should be neatly styled and not extreme or designed to draw attention to the student.

The following outlines the expectations:

- 1. Hair should not be hanging over the face or eyes and needs to be secured such that it does not require constant flicking or handling.
- 2. Hair shoulder length or longer needs to be tied up and back at the nape of the neck, for example, in a ponytail, braid or bun;
- 3. Ribbons, clips and other plain style restrains are to be in the school colours of navy blue or maroon.

For a short overall cut the minimums are a number 2 hair cut up the back of the head, and a number 3 over the top.

Hair colour is not to be changed so that it is noticeably different to a natural colouring. If any student is considering changing her or his hairstyle or colour and is doubtful as to how it would be accepted at school, they should seek the school's guidance first.

# MAKE UP / COSMETICS

Make up is not to be worn at school (this includes eye make-up and nail polish).

# JEWELLERY

Students may wear a:

- 1. watch of reasonable size and appearance
- 2. light chain with a small cross around their neck
- 3. maximum of one plain silver or gold stud or sleeper (small) in the lower lobe of each ear
- 4. "Medic Alert" bracelet.

The consequence of students wearing jewellery other than the outlined above, may be confiscation. Any confiscated items will be held for collection at the end of the day. Please note that chains with any emblems or items other than a cross, are not permitted, nor are any rings, bangles, bracelets or adornments of different material - unless for cultural reasons.

Students are not permitted to wear sleepers, studs or other objects in any visible boy piercing with the exception of (3.) above.

Students are not to undertake any body piercing when there is an insufficient period of time for healing of a hole in order to remain in line with the given expectations. Covering with a bandaid is not acceptable.



### HATS

Hats are a compulsory part of the uniform and must be worn for outdoor play in Term 1 and 4 and are strongly encouraged in Term 2 and 3. The daily temperature is a key indicator of the importance of wearing a hat.

# SCHOOL BAGS

This item carries the school logo and is compulsory and can be purchased from the Uniform Shop.

### UNIFORM SHOP

The onsite uniform shop is located next to the office and can be entered from the undercover courtyard.

The Uniform Shop is open during the term every morning 8.30am -9.00am and every afternoon 3.00pm -3.30pm. New and good quality second-hand uniforms are available. The shop is situated in a room at the back of the administration building. If opening times are unsuitable, appointments may be negotiated.
